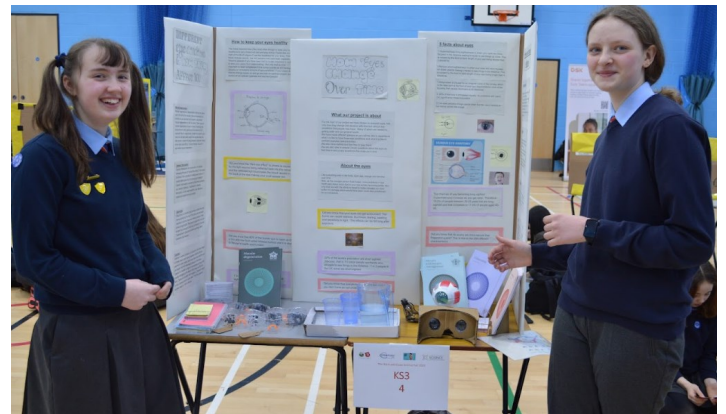
The Big Bang Science Fair

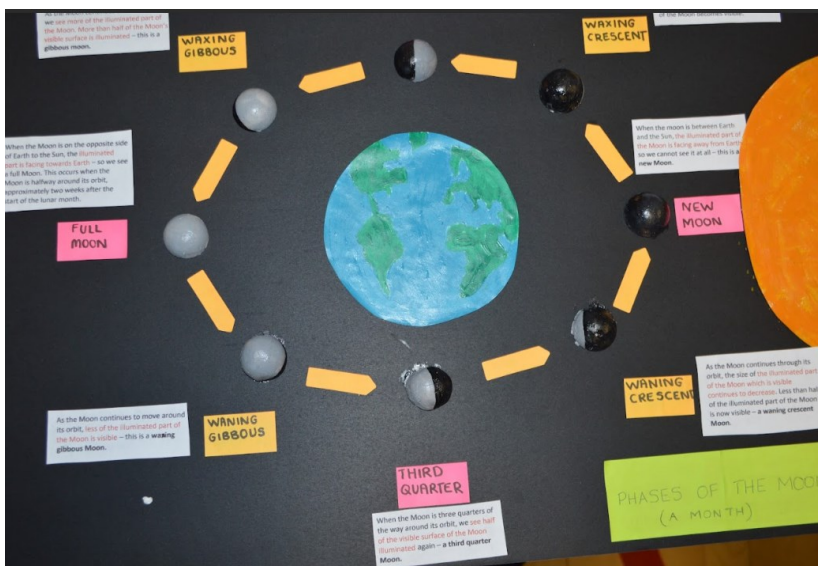
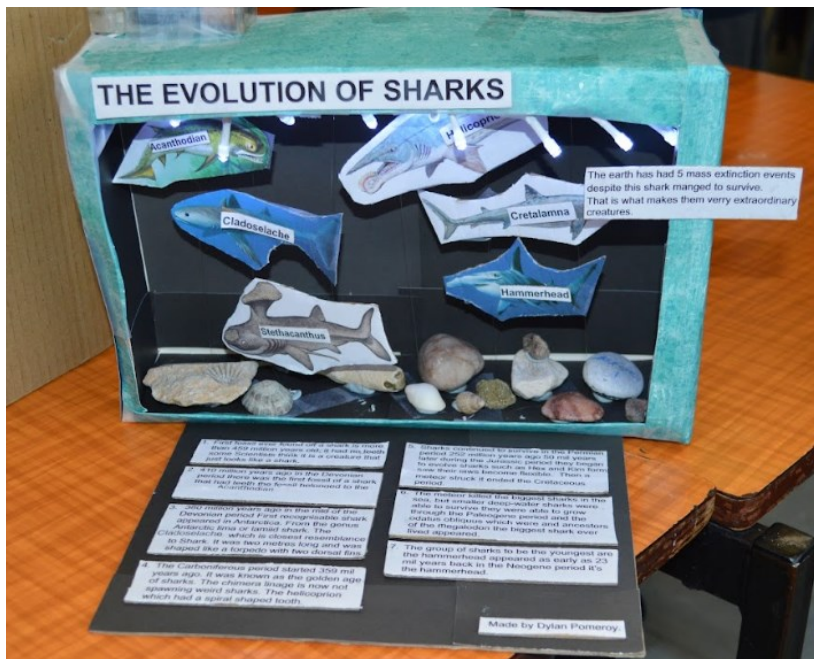












CYCLE

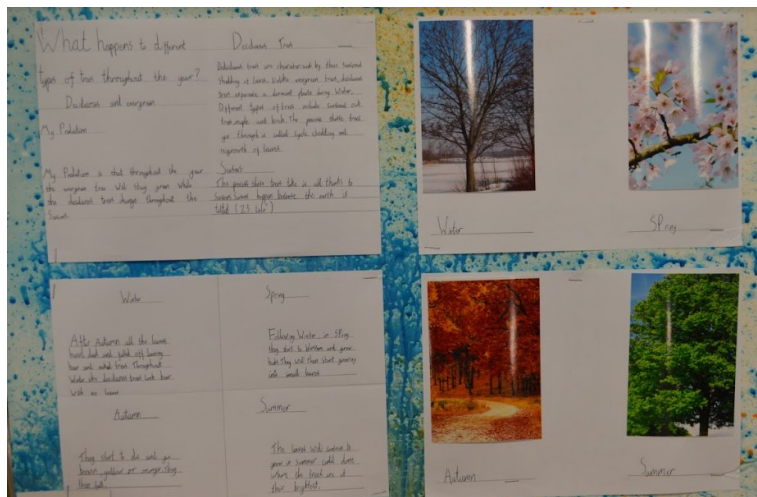
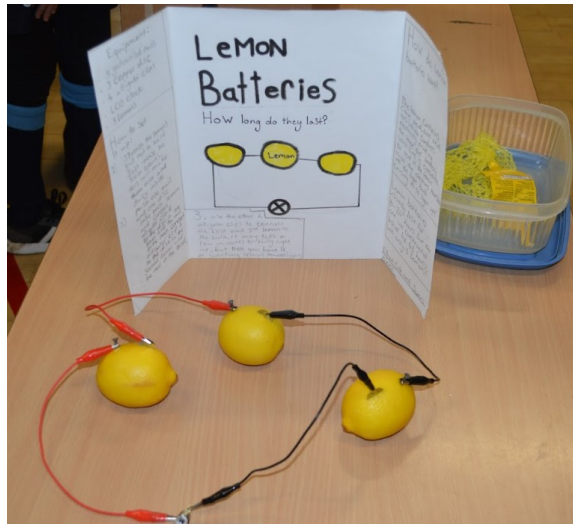
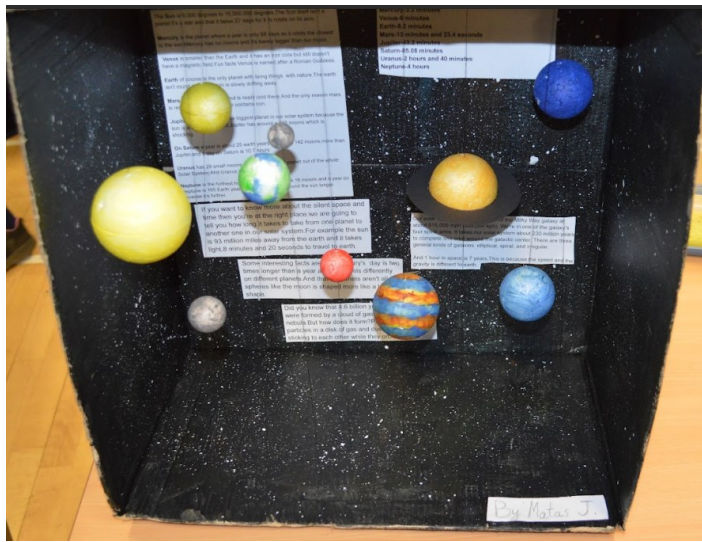

Frog spawn

The female frog releases the egg into the water. The eggs of the frog spawn are surrounded by jelly which absorbs water, swells up and floats to the surface of the pond where the sun warms it. One clump of frog spawn can contain up to 4,000 eggs. After about ten days a tadpole will wriggle out. A frog tad is up to 1 to 2 millimetres.

FROGS

Frogs actually swallow with their eyeballs: they push their eyes down into their mouth and go down their throat. On average a normal age for a frog is 20-30 years. Some species of frogs give birth. It is illegal to sell tadpoles because of diseases ducks can get frog spawn it was reported not so long ago frog

Did you know tadpoles have been and are sometimes used for eating other tadpoles. It can take tadpoles 6 to 9 weeks to come back to the surface of the lake/pond. Tadpoles main attacker is normally water snakes and small turtles small alligators and weirdly raccoons in some parts of the world they tadpoles and lastly about 11 percent of tadpoles have parasites.

Did you know that froglets can travel up to 500 meters on land, any froglets spend time hibernating in autumn did you know froglets need water to change water everyday and it cannot be tap water.
